

President's Message: Barry Hampshire

Well, isn't life interesting? When I wrote the last month's President's Message, I was talking about the courage to be true to ourselves and write about what matters to each of us.

Life then threw me a curve ball and I was challenged to be true to myself as I faced a situation I had not considered for years.

I attended the Ekphrasis reception. When I arrived I didn't feel great, and I crashed fast. I was sick, very sick. I could not recall the last time, I could not cognitively work out how to stand and walk.

In an ironic twist, on the very day that I sold my first piece of writing to someone who wasn't family or a friend, I was admitted to hospital with a serious infection. I stayed for 10 days before the doctors thought I was in the clear. I will admit that some of the experiences of that period will provide me with fuel for some wild and strange stories.

I haven't been in hospital for over 50 years and so it was a rather disturbing to my normal sense of having some control over my life. What an amazing reminder that our sense of control is so much of a fallacy? So I really do encourage everyone to write with abandon, not reckless abandon, because now is the time to write and to write what we may have been reluctant to air before.

We never know what tomorrow will bring, but it could stop us from expressing thoughts that could profoundly affect another person's life. We have today and there is no better time to release a piece of writing that can be incredibly meaningful to another. Never underestimate the potential impact of a memory, an essay, or a piece of fiction when it is committed to paper and shared.

Write on.


Emily Waters


Approximately how long have you been a CWC member? I just joined recently. I thank George Cramer for that!







Thanks to all the Mt. Diablo members who made this contest happen and to members who attended and applauded the students.



One additional prize will be awarded for a piece of flash fiction (350 words) submitted by any **new member (Sept. 2022 through June 2023.)** New members may submit one piece in one of the three bulleted categories and one in this special category.

Closing date for all submittals: September 15, 2023

- -In order that your entry be judged blindly, put your name, title of your work, your email address, and if you fit the new-member category, the date you joined on a cover sheet.
- -If you want feedback, say so on the cover page.
- -Everyone is to include the following wording on the cover page: "This work is entirely my own and does not infringe on any other individual's copyright." And sign electronically.
- -Do NOT include your name or email address anywhere on or in the work itself.
- -Place the title of your piece and page numbers in the header of each page.
- -Unacceptable are pieces that proselytize, are libelous, or contain gratuitous vulgarity.
- -Follow standard professional manuscript preparation practice such as indented paragraphs and correct formatting of dialog.
- -By submitting you are granting the editors the right to do light editing to correct grammar, spelling, and typos. If in-depth editing is needed, the piece will be returned to you to correct and resubmit before the deadline.

Don't write like this

Biden vows to fight for Americans 'wrongly detained' abroad at correspondents' dinner

Are they detained at the correspondents' dinner? No. Likely the writer of the headline wanted to capture attention by using Biden's name as the first word, but the headline would make better sense if it read:

At the correspondents' dinner, Biden vows to fight for Americans wrongly detained.

And why put wrongly detained in single quotes? Likely to save space, but they are incorrectly used either as a quote of what Biden said or to indicate irony. Either of those should be double quotes in American English. The only time single quotes are used in American English is inside double quotes. The British use single quotes for dialogue.



This reads as an ironical direction: you must at least pretend to wash your hands. No quote marks should have been used.

English teachers and editors everywhere are tearing their hair out.

Humility McPherson By Bob Poirier

The Humility Ministries movement began on October 14th, 2012, as a splinter group of a large Pentecostal church in Huntsville, Alabama. The movement took its name from Proverbs 11:12, "With humility comes wisdom."

The founder, Humility McPherson, a direct descendant of Aimee Semple McPherson, evangelist and faith healer, established a set of practices for members to follow to remain in good standing.

The first was compulsory tithing of ten percent of gross income paid directly to Humility.

Second, members were required to wear distinctive shades of purple. Men wore wine-colored, loose-fitting tunics that covered their hips and darker wine-colored sweatpants. Women wore lilaccolored, loose-fitting tunics that came to just above their knees.

Finally, members were required to purchase capsules developed and manufactured by Humility's brother, Ezra McPherson. The men took a large wine-colored capsule twice daily; the women took a smaller lilac-colored capsule twice daily. The capsules, designed to aid in relaxation, procreation, and acceptance of God's word, were a big hit in attracting and retaining members. By the end of 2014, there were over 15,000 followers scattered throughout the Southeastern Bible Belt.

The movement faltered on October 14th, the two-year anniversary of the founding, when Humility pleaded with his followers to buy him a helicopter.

"Jesus spoke to me directly," he preached. "He said I can do His work better if I have a new Sikorsky S76 six-seat helicopter. Jesus will be deeply disappointed if you do not purchase it for me. So please, if you love Jesus, buy me my helicopter."

The request did not go over well. Jimmy John Jackson, a disgruntled member brought reluctantly into the congregation by his wife, was interviewed by Anderson Cooper on national television. Jackson, sitting on a purple tractor in his cotton field and wearing a wine-colored tunic stretched tightly over his protruding belly, spit tobacco juice throughout the interview.

"Jesus didn't have no damn helicopter," Jackson said. "He rode to church on an ass. That should be good enough for Humility McPherson."

The movement faltered further a week later when the *Washington Post* paid for testing the purple "chill pills," as critics called them. The wine-colored capsules contained thirty percent Sildenafil Citrate, the main ingredient in Viagra, and thirty percent Prozac. The lilac-colored pills contained 70 percent Prozac.

The Humility movement dissolved on November 30th, 2015. Other Pentecostal churches absorbed most of the congregations around the South. Humility sold two of the six houses the congregation had bought him and moved to Costa Rica. The other four houses and all five purple Cadillacs were donated to a charity for disabled zebras run by Ezra.

Commented Mr. Jackson in a *60 Minutes* interview. "I knew Humility McPherson was a phony from the get-go," he scoffed. "Everyone knows Humility is a girl's name."
